As membership chairman I will share our membership comparison report results for Vermont as of 11/4/25: 37th place in state rankings at 64.18% (next goal 65% on 11/13/25) and 28th place at 143 off 2024 comparison. Planning or already planning membership drives at our posts in the months ahead to meet our comparation goals.

As we age, one of the eventualities in life that spouses and families of veteran's face is the death of their loved one who served America in uniform. To help ease the burden on loved ones, veterans can make preparations in advance. The first step is to make certain the family has easy access to important documents such as: The veteran's discharge certificate (DD form 214), VA documents, if any, indicating a VA claim number, a copy of all marriage certificates and divorce decrees (if any previous marriages), insurance policies, including beneficiary designation, a copy of the family will (not required for VA benefits), location of safety deposit boxes (not required by VA), Business address, email address, office and cell phone numbers for local American Legion service officer.

Greetings, fellow Legionnaires,

I want to start this message by thanking you all for allowing me to serve you all as Alternate Executive Committee person, representing the Department of Vermont. I will do my best to fulfill my duties.

I had the opportunity to attend Fall Meetings at the American Legion National Headquarters. These meetings allowed me to make connections with other departments.



During the NEC meeting we approved around thirty resolutions. It was interesting to hear some of the debating going back and forth. I have learned a lot from these meetings and plan to attend more in the future.

National Commander Wiley gave a great speech talking about the American Legions stance on the government shutdown. The American Legion issued multiple statements urging Congress to reach a budget solution and reopen the federal government in October. As student veterans saw their GI Bill benefits delayed, American Legion service officers and appeals representatives continued their work, free of charge, on behalf of VA benefits applicants and appellants, including over \$4.5 million in retroactive awards from appeals.

As the Legion called for a permanent solution to pay military personnel in times of government shutdown, records were set for the number of students who will receive American Legion Samsung Scholarships as well as the number of local post activities in support of the Be the One mission to prevent veteran suicide.

Commander Wiley also urges all American Legion family to go to <u>legion.org/action</u>. This site is a site that you can sign up for, and it will send letters to your representatives urging them to vote for veteran's bills.



The Cadet must be selected and recommended by an academic staff person; this information must be sent to the Department for review. Selection will take place with a panel of (5) Past Department Commanders appointed by the Department Commander. The winner will be announced in May and invited to the Department Annual State Convention in June to receive the Award. Information will be sent to ROTC Programs in Vermont only.
