Congratulations to Ronald LaRose for his outstanding dedication, unwavering integrity, and exemplary leadership. His commitment to veterans, community, and ceremonial excellence reflects the very spirit of our mission. Ron was elected as one of our five National Vice Commanders.

I attended the convention as a delegate and was a member of the Finance Committee. No dues increase is anticipated for 2026-2027. Retention of members has a direct effect on our finances. Retention is a legacy-builder. 


Northern Area Commander – Roy McKinnon



Amongst those who tragically lost their lives were: 344 Firefighters, 72 Law enforcement officers, 422 Emergency services and First responders, 55 Military personnel, and many, many more. Without a doubt, this was the most heinous act that has ever occurred on U.S soil. Hence the prolific cry and mantra of "We Will Never Forget" World Trade Center—2,753 lives lost The Pentagon—184 lives lost, Shanksville, Pennsylvania—40 lives lost

Post PR for Department Bulletin – Melvin McKnight, Barre Post 10

The goal of public relations in an American Legion Post is to provide a favorable image of The American Legion and its programs benefiting veterans, youth and communities in the community being served. A post may have a public relations (PR) committee, a Post officer, or a member with interest and ability.

The public relations staff must determine what various publics in the post and in the community need for information from the post, analyze sources within the post to provide what and how it is needed, plan how to meet the needs, and implement to evaluate results.

The ultimate source for any post to develop its public relations program is the *Public Relations Toolkit*. In over 100 pages, this document covers the subject from "What is Public Relations?" to a multitude of tools, including many pre-written fill-in-the-blank scripts. The **Toolkit** is available for download at www.legion.org/publications under Media & Communications.

Every writer in the Post Legion Family who contributes to public relations should have fingertip access to the *Publication Style Guide*. This guide was developed to assist PR staff to be consistent in all written products with the goal of having a uniform style. The success of a correctly written product gains respect for the author and, more importantly, admiration and appreciation of the organization represented. The **Style Guide** is available for download at www.legion.org/publications under Media & Communications.

Sections of the **Style Guide** include quick tips; the use of abbreviations, acronyms and capitalization; titles; and more. Examples:

- Capitalize the "t" in The American Legion only when referring to the main organization or [always] the "T" in Sons of The American Legion. If the name is followed by another word or words, use a lowercase "t": the American Legion Family, the American Legion Riders. Do not abbreviate TAL.
- **Abbreviations**. Write dates without st, nd, rd, th,: April 3, not April 3rd.
- American Legion Auxiliary. Also the Legion Auxiliary or the Auxiliary. [Never Ladies Auxiliary.] Do not capitalize "the" except when starting a sentence. Do not abbreviate ALA.
- **Months.** When used with a specific date, abbreviate only *Jan., Feb., Aug., Sept., Oct., Nov., Dec.* Spell out when using alone or with a year alone.
- **Times.** Use figures except for *noon* and *midnight*: 8 a.m., 5:30 p.m., 6 p.m.
- **State names.** State name abbreviations are used in text: *Vt., N.H., N.Y., Mass.,* Conn. Use two-letter Postal Service abbreviations only with full addresses, including ZIP code: *VT, NH, NY, CT.* Postal code abbreviations for eight states are not abbreviated in text are *AK (Alaska), HI (Hawaii), ID (Idaho), ME (Maine), OH (Ohio), TX (Texas), UT (Utah).* Also, *District of Columbia (DC).* There should be two spaces between the state abbreviation and the ZIP code in a mailing address.

The information above is from another helpful tool, the Associated Press Stylebook, 56th Edition, on which the Legion style guide is based.
