Size: No larger than 11 by 17 paper.

Judging Criteria: Expression of the theme – "*Take a Stand Against Bullying.*" Creativity and originality, visual clarity, broad audience appeal, educational value and if the poster is easy to read and understand.

Judging: One finalist will be selected from each school district. Our Judges will choose the overall winner. Voting will be on May 11, 2019. The Children and Youth Chairman will notify winners the following week.

Prizes: There will be three top winners selected who will receive first, second and third place trophies. All students who participate will receive a certificate of participation and a copy of "Bridging the Gap" an educational comic book to help middle school age children recognize, prevent and stop bullying. **Note:** the top winners will have their poster displayed at the Department of Vermont Annual Convention held June 28-29 at the Double Tree Hotel in Burlington. The first place student will be invited to attend the convention on June 29.

Posters will become the property of the American Legion, Department of Vermont and maybe used for promotional purposes as well as appear on social media and newspaper articles. Submitting an entry signifies that you have read and understand these rules and agree to the terms.
